

PUBLISHING GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

MONOGRAPHIC BOOK ON INDIGENOUS CINEMA

««INDIGENOUS CINEMA» IN PERSPECTIVE. GAZES, STORIES, AND RESISTANCES»

Articles submitted for this publication must be original and unpublished. Publication in the journal is subject to the peer review and editorial process. Each author will be informed by e-mail about the process and the decision of the editorial team. No article submitted for this monograph may be simultaneously submitted for other publications.

The average length of each article/chapter in the book must be between 8,000 and 15,000 words, including bibliographic references. Exceptionally long submitted articles/chapters must be more relevant to the field than those considered publishable. Articles/chapters will be peer-reviewed within a maximum of one month. Authors will be notified of the process by email, where they will receive comments from both reviewers and the Editorial Board.

Submissions should be related to the topic of the book, otherwise they will be rejected. Authors are requested to submit final versions of their proposals that best meet our editorial guidelines, so as not to unnecessarily prolong the review and editing process.

General Criteria

- Title centered in 16pt Times New Roman
- The author's name should be centered in 11pt Times New Roman.
- The affiliation or organization should be centered in 9pt Times New Roman italics below the name.

Letter-sized page (21.59 cm x 27.94 cm)

- The main text should be in 12pt Times New Roman, 1.5 line spacing, and justified. The second and subsequent paragraphs after the title and subheadings should be indented 0.5 cm from the first line.
- Use a maximum of three headings: first-level 1. HEADING in 14pt Times New Roman; second-level 1.1. HEADING in 14pt Times New Roman; and third-level 1.1.1. HEADING in 11pt Times New Roman.
- If you are using footnotes, place them at the bottom of the page where they are referenced in 8pt Times New Roman, justified.
- References are organized alphabetically in 11pt Times New Roman with 0.5cm indentation, 1.5cm spacing, and justified. We ask authors to be very careful when using APA formatting. This often takes editors a lot of time, so we hope authors will give their full attention to organizing references in the best possible way.

Tables

Tables must be submitted as editable text and not as images. Tables can be placed within the text or on separate pages at the end. Tables must be numbered and include a heading.

Figures

Figures, maps, and photos must be submitted in separate files, numbered consecutively according to their position in the text. These files can be sent together in one or more compressed files (.zip, .rar) with a maximum size of 4 MB. EPS (or PDF) or TIFF (or JPEG) files with a minimum resolution of 300 dpi are accepted. Figure captions must be included at the end of the text. A maximum of 10 figures per article/chapter will be accepted.

Reference system

This reference system is limited to the works cited in the text, which are listed at the end of the article. Below are some examples of the most common documents and two notes to bear in mind:

Periodical publications (journal articles)

First author's surname(s), initial(s) of first name(s), second author's surname(s), initial(s) of first name(s), and last author's surname(s), initial(s) of first name(s). (year of publication). Title of the article. Name of journal, volume (issue), first and last pages (without specifying pages, pp., or other abbreviations). DOI (in full, including the https protocol).

Monographs (books):

First author's surname(s), initial(s) of first name(s). Second author's surname(s), initial(s) of first name(s). Last name(s), initial(s) of first name(s) of last author(s). (Year of publication). Title of the monograph. Publisher. DOI (in full, including the https protocol).
